
Thank you for your letter expressing the Texas Department of Agriculture's support for the recovery of Gulf of Mexico fishing industries from the impact of the Deepwater Horizon BP oil spill, and the importance of education campaigns about the safety of Gulf of Mexico seafood. I share your concerns and commend the significant effort the Gulf States have made toward creating and implementing these consumer education campaigns.

At the end of July 2010, President Obama signed into law H.R. 4899, the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2010. These appropriations included \$15 million for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) to respond to the fishery disaster declared as a result of the Deepwater Horizon BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. This funding was required to be obligated by the end of fiscal year 2010 (September 30).

NOAA has provided this \$15 million in a grant to the Gulf States Marine Fisheries Commission for assistance to the Gulf fishing industry through programs designed to market Gulf seafood products and provide health and safety assurances for those products. The Commission will develop and implement a 5-year outreach and marketing program to raise public awareness of the quality and safety of seafood. The grant will also help the Gulf States develop strong seafood quality assurance testing.
