### **Agriculture Memorial Day Honors Fallen Farmers and Ranchers**

On Nov. 21, Commissioner Miller honored the men and women who have lost their lives in ag industry in a solemn ceremony at the State Capitol. Members of the ag community came together to remember Texas farmers and ranchers who died in the previous year. The event was created by John Paul Dineen III, who lost his young son in an agriculture-related accident.

"This is a day of reflection, but it's also a day that strengthens and lifts up our ag family," Commissioner Miller said. "Today is an important reminder that for generations Texas farmers and ranchers have given

their lives to produce the food and fiber the world needs. Here at the Texas Department of Agriculture, we remember their sacrifice every day, and we hope that all Texans take a moment to do the same."

### Gift of Produce Gives Back to Texans in Need This Holiday

This year, the Houston Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Association (HFFVA) is celebrating 31 years of the Gift of Produce, an event that benefits the Houston Food Bank. The food bank serves 18 Southeast Texas counties, and this year's event takes on new significance as the food bank continues to be instrumental in recovery efforts following the devastation of Hurricane Harvey. Right now, the food bank is distributing two-to-three times its normal capacity, and these efforts will continue for many months.

The Gift of Produce brings together HFFVA's retailers, wholesalers, brokers, growers and shippers to provide valuable donations to the Houston Food Bank. This year's goal is to donate the equivalent of 2.5–3 million pounds of produce. Because of an increased demand for produce to assist in hurricane recovery, this year's Gift of Produce will include cash donations. One dollar can provide three meals thanks to the food bank's relationship with multiple organizations like TDA.

TDA partners with food banks across Texas in a variety of programs including the Commodity Supplemental Food Program and the Emergency Food Assistance Program. These enable food banks to connect low-income Texans with U.S. Department of Agriculture foods they can take home. In the week's following Hurricane Harvey, TDA and food banks in presidentially declared disaster areas also used the Disaster Household Distribution Program to connect families with food packages. Please join TDA and organizations like HFFVA in supporting local food banks. Anything you can give — time, money or food — will help them serve more Texans. Just contact your local food bank or food pantry to see how you can help. This is something we can all do this holiday season and, more importantly, throughout the year.
