ICYMI: China Deal and U.S. Dairy, Commissioner Miller Speaks Out About WOTUS

Just last month, Commissioner Miller congratulated the efforts of the U.S. Dairy Export Council (USDEC), the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and China's Certification and Accreditation Administration (CNCA) on their hard work to create an agreement that will drastically increase U.S. dairy exports to China.

"This is a win for dairy producers across the nation but especially Texas producers," Commissioner Miller said. Click here to read Commissioner Miller's full statement.

In related news, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a decision in June to repeal the Obama administration-era Clean Water Rule and revisit the definition of Waters of the U.S. (WOTUS) before creating new rules. The move is a step in the right direction to remove EPA's burdensome overregulation of farmers and ranchers across Texas and the nation, Commissioner Miller said.

"More than half of the states in this country filed lawsuits against the EPA over the WOTUS definition in the Clean Water Rule," Commissioner Miller said. "The EPA's attempt to control the use of our own land and water for agriculture production and to earn a livelihood was a threat to private property rights, individual freedom and economic growth in our country." 
Summer Meals Available to Texas Children

Amarillo to the list of great Texas cities where FMNP is supporting farmers markets and local economies. Amarillo joins Dallas, San Antonio, Fort Worth, Tyler, Austin, Pharr, Houston, Lubbock and Wichita Falls. SFMNP is available in Wichita Falls and San Antonio. In each city, TDA partners with the city government, a food bank or local nonprofit group to distribute booklets of vouchers to low-income Texans. Participants redeem the vouchers for fresh foods like the squash, cucumbers and tomatoes that are in season now and available at many TDA-certified farmers markets.
